

The West Lafayette School Corporation is a member of the Wildcat Creek Career Cooperative (WCCC), a joint venture of the public schools in the Tippecanoe, Clinton, and Benton counties. WCCC offers career/technical education programs in which students from any of the member school corporations may participate.

Students must formally apply through their high school counselor for participation in the WCCC in the school year prior to intended participation. Acceptance for enrollment is based upon a review of appropriate prerequisite courses as well as academic, attendance and discipline records. Students approved for enrollment in these programs spend part of their day in required classes at the WL campus and then are released to the career/technical cooperative site. Every effort will be made to coordinate the two schedules. Acceptance into and enrollment in a WCCC program is a yearlong commitment and there can be no mid-term graduates. Credits and grades are earned in all programs and are included in the GPA and transcript. Students may be responsible for part or all fees connected to some of the programs. The student knows these fees before they agree to the course.

Students must remain in good standing in both the WCCC program and at the WL site in order to continue in the program. Continuing enrollment is at the discretion of the administration. If school is missed at WL, the student cannot attend the WCCC program unless prior arrangements have been made with attendance at WLHS.
